New Training Partnership Announced between Tourism and Acadian Associations - Halifax, NS (November 12, 2008)

The Nova Scotia Tourism Human Resource Council (NSTHRC) is pleased to have signed an agreement with le Conseil de developpement economique de la Nouvelle-Ecosse (CDÉNÉ) to partner in the training of the Nova Scotia tourism sector's Francophone workforce.
